Three years ago I saw the potential of industrial hemp with the passing of Colorado's Amendment 64, a citizen's initiative that freely allows farmers to grow and process hemp in Colorado. Over the past 2½ years I expanded the RMHA into the National Hemp Association (NHA), which became the most active industrial hemp trade association in the nation.
